St Hildeburgh's annual meeting and elections take place on Sunday 21st April at 11.00am (following the 10am service). We are looking to find one person to serve on the PCC, and two to serve on the Deanery Synod.

The PCC is the official, decision-making body of our church, and meetings take place approximately every two months, usually on a Monday evening. Meetings last about an hour.

The Deanery Synod meets about three times each year at differing churches in north Wirral. The synod examines a wide-range of church matters. Our Deanery Synod representatives automatically become members of our PCC.

The term of office of both roles is three years. The work is both interesting and important, but not onerous.
