#### FLOWER OF THE WEEK: CHOISYA

# 144th in a series.

CHOISYAS come from the warm regions of the southern United States and Mexico, but most are surprisingly comfortable in the British climate. They are medium-sized evergreen shrubs, reaching a maximum of 2.5m (8ft) in height and spread but usually less. It is tidily mound-shaped, with shapely, aromatic leaves of rich mid-green and white, five-petalled blooms.

The most popular species is *Choisya ternata*, nicknamed Mexican orange blossom (pictured), which produces fragrant flowers prolifically in late spring. A variety bred from this, *Choisya ternata* Sundance (pictured), makes an unfailingly bright feature all year, growing to 1.5m (5ft) tall. Its golden-green foliage is the highlight and, although it does not flower as freely as its parent species, it does produce a reasonable number of scented white flowers. However, the all-year display of its bright leaves is the highlight, especially in a gloomy area of the garden.

Choisya Aztec Pearl is another delightful type with more delicate foliage, darker green, and white flowers, sometimes tinged with pink, in spring and again in late summer and autumn. Choisya arizonica is a smaller, more erect shrub, to 1m (3ft), also with pink-tinged blooms. It is not fully hardy in Britain so should be planted in a sheltered position.

Choisyas need well-drained soil to grow well and are prone to attack by snails. They can be pruned lightly to maintain size and shape after flowering.


The genus *Choisya* was named in honour of 19th-century Swiss botanist Jacques Choisy while the specific title *ternata* refers to the leaf grouping in clusters of three.
