PCC Report - Monday 22 January 2024



St Hildeburgh's Parochial Church Council (our church's decision-making body) met on Monday 22 January 2024. The following, is a brief summary of what was discussed at the meeting:

Safeguarding

Peter Ham, our Parish Safeguarding Office (PSO), presented a report and alerted members to the fact that those members of the church with leadership and other positions must have a DBS check, and undertake some online training. This matter is now getting pressing.

Financial Position

Our finances are in a satisfactory state. However, weekly planned given has fallen substantially since the period of Covid.

Admission of Children to Communion at School

Rev Paul raised the matter of whether baptised but unconfirmed children, aged seven and upwards, should be admitted to communion, when Holy Communion takes place at school. There was discussion. It was resolved that Rev Paul will explore this as an option.

Brickwork

The bricks on the west end of the church are very seriously damaged by weathering. The PCC resolved to have the brickwork repaired by a stonemasonry company that has submitted the best quote. The work will be overseen by our church architect. We now need to gain permissions from the church/diocesan authorities for the work to be undertaken.

Organ

From not working at all, the organ is now working very well indeed following work on its motor and the organ's electrical System.

Church Central Heating

The central heating in church has received attention: Air locks have been dealt with the system topped up with more water.

Tree Survey/Matters

A tree survey was undertaken last summer to ensure that all the trees in the church grounds are in a safe condition. One case for concern was a Scots pine with a split trunk near the entrance of the car park. This tree has now been braced and secured. All the other trees are in a satisfactory condition.

Volunteers Needed!

The church needs more volunteers! This is across a range of our activities with the Christmas Tree Festival being a key example. Please do consider whether you could be involved. The future of a number of our activities depends on volunteers coming forward.

Prayerful Art Sessions

What is a Prayerful Art session like?

Our sessions begin with a friendly chat before Alice introduces the week's theme. Recent themes have been: joy, journey, light and darkness.

We might spend a little time talking about the theme in order to spark some inspiration. Alice also provides the group with simple ideas that you could choose to follow if you wish. All the equipment is provided (pens, pencils, paint, paper etc), and Alice is around to offer any support or help you may like. Each person decides how they want to respond to the theme creatively, there are no right or wrong answers. We then spend the remainder of the session creating our projects, relaxing and sharing together.

What do you create?

We create all sorts of things. Check out the noticeboard in the church hall for some examples. What we create is less important than the process of actually creating it. The group exists to provide a space to reflect and pray, and to do this creatively. Often we might not like the picture we've created, but we've enjoyed revisiting a memory or reflecting on an experience, and that is more important.

Do I need to be good at art?

No! This isn't about being able to draw or being good at art. You can respond to the theme however you wish, so that could be with words and doodles.

Do I have to attend every week?

No, come to as many sessions as you would like. The beauty of doing a different theme each week is that it doesn't matter whether you come to one week or every week.

Come and try a session. We meet 2-3.30pm on Thursday afternoons in the church hall.
