**FLOWER OF THE WEEK: CANDYTUFT**  
**97th in a series**

Candytuft is one of the easiest cottage-garden flowers to grow. Just sow the seeds where you want them to flower in any soil as long as it is well-drained and they will produce bushy mounds up to 30cm (1ft) tall which have attractive, lance-shaped leaves and are covered in small, scented blooms. They are really obliging: reliably hardy, a good edging or a trailing cover for rockeries, unaffected by exhaust fumes, and excellent for children to try because they come up so vigorously.

Seeds are best sown now where they are to flower. The plants prefer full sunlight and fairly poor, light soil with good drainage. The lightly-scented flowers, which appear variously from March to August – and are already in bloom in many Wirral gardens – can be white, pink, lavender, purple or crimson. Protection from slugs and snails is often necessary and, as candytuft belongs to the cabbage family, plants can be affected by clubroot.

Candytuft's botanical name is *Iberis*, so called because many members of the genus come from the Iberian Peninsula, stretching from Gibraltar to Portugal in south-west Europe. The common name, candytuft, has nothing to do with confectionery but is derived from Candia, the former name of Iraklion on the island of Crete.

*Iberis umbellata*, the common candytuft, is a spreading or trailing annual, blooming from late spring to summer. Among the best hybrids are the Fairy series, which have white, pink or lilac flowers, and the Flash series, with very bright pink, red or purple flowers. *Iberis amara*, another annual, produces 45cm (18in) domes of numerous blooms, generally white, in summer. *Iberis sempervirens*, is an evergreen perennial, spreading up to 40cm (16in), and producing snow-white flowers.

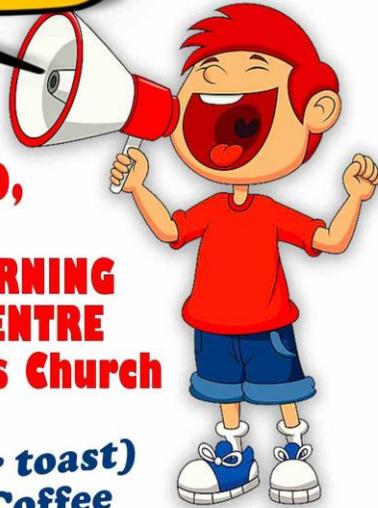
